Southern Ocean Lodge on Kangaroo Island Named in TIME World's Greatest Places List

As works continue in the rebuild of Baillie Lodges flagship property Southern Ocean Lodge, TIME has named the luxury lodge on the wild west coast of South Australia's Kangaroo Island as one of 50 extraordinary travel destinations around the world for 2023.

The 2022 addition of Chile's esteemed Tierra Hotels group marks a continuation of the collection's foray into international waters, joining the Clayoquot Wilderness Lodge on Canada's Vancouver Island and New Zealand's Huka Lodge.
